WILL OF DANIEL STOUT; dated 26 Oct 1769 proved 7 Aug 1770.

In the name of God, Amen, I DANIEL STOUT of Frederick County in the Colony of Virginia being weak in body and of sound memory this twenty sixty day of October, in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven and sixty nine make and publish my Last Will and Testament in manner following (that is to say) first I give to my three sons Viz GOODFRIED DANIEL, JOHN & GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT my Tract of Land situated on Stony Creek in Frederick County in the Colony of Virginia to each of them one hundred & fifty acres more or less and first I give to my son GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT his heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns one hundred & fifty acres of Land more or less it being the upper part of my Tract of Land whereon I now live in Frederick County in the Colony of Virginia from Godlip Links line down Stony Creek with all Buildings and Improvements that is thereon and my Wife, ELIZABETH STOUT, & my two sons, JOHN & GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT shall keep house together also on that Part of the Land whereon I now live as long as they can agree and my Wife is Willing to keep house and also, I give all my Personal Estate Chattle and household goods and the grain that is now in the field to my Wife ELIZABETH STOUT and to my two sons JOHN and GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT and if my Wife cant keep house any longer, my son GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT his heirs Executors and Administrators or Assigns or whoever has possession of the Land I give him, shall give to my said Wife ELIZABETH yearly and every year During her natural life, five bussels of Wheat and six bussels of Rie and fifty pounds of corn and Sow a Quarter of an acre of ground with flax seed and keep her proper use one mare become on his own proper cost and my wife ELIZABETH STOUT send my two sons JOHN and GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT to school until they have sufficient Schooling. Also I give one hundred & fifty acres of land more or less to my son JOHN STOUT, his heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns next to my son GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT's land and from his line down Stoney Creek and also I give to my son GOODFRIED DANIEL STOUT, to his Executors Adaministrators or Assigns one hundred and fifty acres of Land more or less beginning at my son JOHN STOUT's line down Stoney Creek to the lower line of my said Tract of Land and my wife ELIZABETH STOUT and my sons JOHN STOUT and GEORGE BENJAMIN STOUT shall give to my son PETER STOUT the value of Five Pounds Virginia Currency in good and chattel after my Decease and they shall also give the value of Twenty Shillings Virginia Currency in goods to each of my two grandchildren, ELIZABETH COFFIELD and DANIEL COFFIELD to be Paid when they come of age or are married & my wife ELIZABETH STOUT shall demand all the money that is due to me and shall therewith Pay all my Debts. And I make and Ordain her my said Wife ELIZABETH STOUT and JACOB WOLF, JUNR. Sole Executrix of this my Will in Trust for the Intents & purposes on this my Will contained to take care and see the same performed according to my True Intent & Meaning. In Witness whereof the said DANIEL STOUT have to this my Last Will & Testament set my hand & Seal the day & Year above Written, Signed Sealed & delivered by the said DANIEL STOUT as and for his Last Will & Testament in the presence of us who were present at the Signing & Sealing Whereof,

At a Court held for Frederick County August 7th 1770 this Last Will and Testament of DANIEL STOUT Dec'd was Proved by the Oathes of Curtiss Sink & George Weaver witnesses thereto and ordered to be Recorded at the Motion of Elizabeth Stout the Executrix who made Oath thereto Certificate granted her for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form the giving Security Whereupon she together with Curtis Sink & Jacob Wolf Junr. entered into & acknowledged a Bond in the Penalty of Two Hundred Pounds conditioned for her due and faithful Administration of said Estate. In the name of God Amen, I ELIAS COFFELT of Dunmore County in Virginia being weak in body but of sound and Disposing mind and memory thanks be to God for the same Calling to mind the mortality of man, I do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, First I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Decent Christian like burial at the discretion of my Executors herein after mentioned and such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this lief I give Demise and Dispose of in the following manner and form and First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife MARY BARBARA one third of the Land and Tenement I now live on situate on Stoney Creek in the above aforesaid County during her life and the remainder of said Land and Tenement I give and bequeath the same unto my beloved son DANIEL COFFELT and his heirs and assigns after my said wifes Decease my son DANIEL COFFELT shall also have her third of said Land and Tenement & my son DANIEL shall pay the sum of Sixty Pounds current money of Virginia which said money shall be equally divided amongst all my children and each one to have an Equal share as the other to be paid to them as they comne of age but as my oldest Daughter ELIZABETH shall come to age before my son DANIEL she is not to have her share of said money untill my son DANIEL shall come to his age and then she shall have a Right to Demand it and I give also unto my beloved wife MARY BARBARA the third part of my Personal Estate Chattels and household goods & it is my will that the same be Equally divided amongst all my children and I do also make and ordain Constitute and appoint my beloved Wife MARY BARBARA and my brother GEORGE COFFELT sole Executors of this My Last Will and Testament and I do hereby Disannul and Disallow all and every other and former wills and Testaments by me heretofore made, Ratifying and allowing this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament. Captain Daniel or Godfrey Daniel Stout of the Revolutionary War was, according to family tradition, of German descent and came from Pennsylvania through the Shenandoah Valley to Sullivan County, Tennessee and settled on the left bank of the Holston River near the mouth of Jacobs Creek; spring on right bank (a Mr. Dogget lives at the same place now). The house was still standing up to a few years ago. (Date of writing 1933).

On the Register's Books in Carter County deeds are executed by Godfrey Daniel or Daniel Stout, conveying land to his sons and sons-in-law.

He and his wife, Catherina, are buried in a country cemetery in a community known as "Little Doe". The cemetery is now called the Asa Shoun Cemetery.

(The paper below is the only known proof to support DAR old record that Godfrey Daniel Stout was a patriot for the Revolutionary War-- no other records exist showing him to be a soldier.)

I DO hereby certify, that DANIEL STOUT hath taken and subscribed the oath of affirmation of allegiance and fidelity, as directed by an act of General Assembly intituled An act to oblige the free male inhabitants of this state above a certain age to give assurance of allegiance to the Same, and for other purposes. Witness my hand and seal, this 10th day of August 1777.

The above is a true copy of the record of allegiance as made by Daniel Stout before Abrm. Smith, who was acting for the government, as evidence by the last three letters which apparently form a seal of some sort. Except

for the names and dates the form appears in print. This original paper is in the possession of a descendant of Daniel Stout, J. H. Pierce, County Supt. of Schools, Mountain City, Tenn.

Item, I give and bequeath unto each of my daughters to wit, Mary the wife of John Willfang, CATHARINE, the wife of DANIEL STOUT, Margaret, the wife of George Dellinger, Magdalene, the wife of Emanuel Dellinger, Sussanah, the wife of Henry Hoshaur, Rosinah, the wife of Jacob Helsley, Junr., and Barbara, the wife of George Anderick and their Heirs the sum of ten Dollars, and I also give ten Dollars to the Children of my daughter Elizabeth Stickly, dec'd. to be equally divided amongst them and my said son George Voltz or whosoever possess the plantation and lands, I have hereby given him as above mentioned shall pay the same in the following manner to wit: the ten dollars which I have given my eldest daughter Mary Willfang he shall pay within twelve months after my deceased, and then he shall pay ten dollars that is to say one legacy every year afterwards untill the whole ten legacies are fully paid always preferring the eldest of my said daughters before the younger in paying the said legacies. Item, all my wearing apparel and my Books I give and bequeath unto my three sons, namely, Joshua Voltz, Joseph Voltz, and the said George Voltz to be equally divided amongst them, and after payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses, all the remainder of my estate both Real and Personal of what nature or kind 'soever it may be, not herein before particularly disposed of, I desire may be equally divided among all my Children herein before named which I give to them their Heirs Executors Administrations or assigns forevery. And Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Joshua Voltz sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament by me heretofore made, Ratifying this and no other to be my last Will & Testament. The parents are donating this book to their daughter for her memory and to remind her that she shall remember her parents and shall pray incessantly to God and shall remember also that she has been baptised, also that she will not betray and will not abandon the truths of God and so that she will not come into wrong doing, for you should have all your life long God before your eyes and in your heart, and you shall be ware yourself not to agree to any sin or act against the commands of God.

Recorded on a Fly Leaf at the beginning of a second section of the book:

Catherine Stauten born Boltzen got married to her husband Daniel Stauten in the year 1772, the 3rd of March.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my wife, Sarah Robinson, all the horse, cattle, hogs and other stock of whatever kind which I may die possessed of except as herein after directed, all the money I have in possession or which is due me from any and all persons, all my notes on any and all persons whether calling for money or trade, all my blacksmith tools, farming tools, and merchanical tools, of every description, all my household and kitchen furniture of every kind and description, all my grain of every kind including corn, oats, wheat and all the personal property of every kind except as hereinafter directed, everything she may raise on the land on

which I now live, every species of property she may accumulate. I also give and bequeath to her the privilege of tending, using or renting any portion of my land which she may choose, also the use and possession of my dwelling house and other buildings.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my son, John Robinson my black horse.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Taylor two cows.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Margaret Taylor, wife of Thomas Taylor my tract of land lying North of the stage road and North and west of the tract of land which I have given and deeded to my son John Robinson as far as the lower end of a clover field below where my son Zaceriah Robinson now lives and bounded on the Northeast by lands of Samuel Howard, by the fence to the point of a leading ridge, then up said ridge running a southwest course on the line described in the deed consolidating several tracts of land including the land on which I live, then with said last mentioned line South to the land of Johnson Robinson, with the following conditions (viz) the said Margaret Taylor and her husband Thomas Taylor are to maintain, nourish and cherish my wife Sarah Robinson and in every way conduct themselves towards her as becomes children towards a parent to the satisfaction of her the said Sarah Robinson to her satisfaction she may dispossess them at any time and cause them to leave her premises and in that case they shall forfeit any title to said land and this will shall convey no title to the said Margaret. As a further condition the said Margaret and Thomas Taylor or either of them shall not be permitted to cut any cordwood or any timber on said tract of land, except what may be necessary for the use of the said farm.

Letters written by John Stout's granddaughter, Susan Margaret Willet in Washington Co. TN to her cousin Washington Swisher Rector in Texas. (located in Barker History Library of the University of Austin, Austin, TX- "Washington Swisher Rector collection")...give the following information: Letter dated October 4, 1868 "Grandfather Stout is not expected to live until Christmas..." Letter dated January 18, 1869.. "Sad news, our Dear old Grandfather departed this life last Sunday night the 10th inst., is not more. Yesterday he was buried on the 12th... Poor old Grandfather has lived a long life longer I think than any of his children will live. They all took it very hard and will miss him so much.. I was sorryer for Aunt Phebe than any of the children. She was the baby and care more for him then any one and will miss him more. I don't know what would have become of him and grandmother if it was not for her." March 16, 1869.. "Uncle Daniel and Uncle John angry about money from grandpa's estate." February 3, 1870 "Brother E. D. (Elbert Decatur Willet) visited us about Christmas, was here at the sale the eighth day of January... E. D. bought the old homestead. He gave forty-six hundred dollars for one hundred acres. If it had not been for him, Uncle Gum (Francis Montgomery Stout) and Uncle Will would have got the place very low. The people said E. D. give a plenty for the land. Grandmother (Rachel Irvin Stout) did not like very much for him to buy the place."

16 May 1832 - Samuel Broyles vs Adam Broyles & others

Complainant is entitled to relief - Settlement of CYRUS BROYLES, dec'd. Washington County, Tennessee - 15 Sept. 1806 Cyrus Broyles divided his land between his children - all except Rachel who married John Lemon and Ann who married respondent Adam Broyles. All received amount of the estate equal to \$333.03. At that division John Lemon received \$199.60 and Adam \$184. In 1818 Adam received a negro woman from the intestate in his lifetime for \$300 for which he never paid anything. A negro man was sold, brought back from jail at Abingdon. John Winkle owed intestate - not was delivered to mother of Winkle by Adam, Whiskey and brandy furnished at the sale of intestate dec'd. Were Tobias and Daniel Broyles solvent? Bill is dismissed against, Daniel, Sarah, Alfred, Polly, Catharine, John & Steven STOUT, Joseph Willet and wife and Allen STOUT grandchildren of CYRUS BROYLES.
